THEME: Stronger Together!

WHO MAY ENTER: The contest is open to all students in *grades 6-12* in all public, private, and parochial schools of Brazoria County.

HOW TO ENTER: Individual students may submit only one essay by email at essays@mlkcc.org

CONTEST DEADLINE: All essays must be submitted by 4:00 p.m. Thursday, January 28, 2021.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF WINNERS: Winners will be contacted by phone and awards will be presented to first, second and third place winners. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the award ceremony date/time/location will be determined at a later date.

CONTEST INFORMATION:

- 1. Each year, the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration Committee sponsors an essay contest in honor of the Dr. King's Holiday.
- 2. Copies of these Official Guidelines are available on the Brazoria County MLKCC Website: http://www.mlkcc.org
- 3. The intent of the Essay Contest is to provide all students with an opportunity to learn about Dr. King, his message and his work; to give students an opportunity to reflect on our present and the future in light of Dr. King's purpose; and to encourage continued study through financial awards that can hopefully help students continue their lives and education with a permanent appreciation for Dr. King.
- 4. Based on the theme Stronger Together, describe what it means to you and how will it impact our community.

ESSAY FORMAT (Please read carefully):

- 1. Each essay should be between 300 -350 words, typewritten, double-spaced, 12 font and printable on 8½ x 11 paper.
- 2. Each page should be numbered consecutively. Hand written essays will not be accepted.
- 3. Each entry must include a title page containing the following information:
 - The Title: Stronger Together!
 - Name, phone number, email, grade, name of school and school district. (*This information should appear only on the title page since the essays will be judged with this page removed*).

CRITERIA FOR JUDGING:

- 1. Content-- Interpretation of and adherence to the subject 30%
- **2.** Expression--Choice of words, imagery, and style 20%
- 3. Form-- Organization, idea development -20%
- **4.** Mechanics-- Grammar, spelling, neatness and punctuation -20%
- 5. Overall Presentation-- Interest, appeal, clarity, and adherence to contest rules 10%

Essays are judged carefully on the basis of these criteria and compliance with the rules of the contest. A panel of judges will select the final winners. The judges will not know the entrants' names at the time of judging.

PUBLICATION PERMISSION:

By entering the contest, the essays become the property of the MLKCC and may be used for display in the community and/or media by the committee. The entry may not be returned. The selected essay may be digitally altered to assure quality reproduction.
